

Most beloved clergy and monastics, sons and daughters, faithful children of our God-protected Diocese of Eastern America!

We greet you on this, The Feast of Feasts – The Resurrection of Christ, albeit during this most trying epoch of the COVID-19 pandemic. Yet, from our paternal heart emanating with Paschal joy and emboldened by the hope-filled words of St. Gregory the Theologian, we exclaim the ever-resounding and victorious Christian greeting:

CHRIST IS RISEN!

"Yesterday I was crucified with You, O Christ; **Today I abound with glory.** Yesterday I died with You; **Today I am filled with life.** Yesterday I was buried with You; **Today I arise with You.**" (St. Gregory the Theologian)

Out of great love for one another, we have been separated, beloved, to repress the dire effects of the coronavirus pandemic, which rage throughout the world. The love of Christ keeps us together as a community bound in love and, indeed, a community of love! For no matter how weak and how frail we are as individual persons, when we are brought together as a community of faithful, with Christ is our midst, we become a perfected community of love – His love! We must then ask ourselves: *"who will separate us from the love of Christ? Will hardship, or distress, or persecution, or famine, or nakedness, or peril, or sword?"* (Rom. 8:35). As nothing can separate us from the love of Christ or from one another, we must understand that our self-isolation remains an act of selflessness and not self-centeredness!

Rejoice, therefore, for He, Who was crucified for us and for our salvation, rose on the third day. Our life will, thereby, conclude not in death, but in the Victory of Life over death. Crowned no longer with a wreath of thorns, rather by self-sacrificial love, glowing in the radiance of the Resurrection, He filled all in all with light. For He is the light of this world! Now the eye of the heart can perceive, through this unique prism, the very meaning of life itself. Only then will we understand the abundant and deeply personal meaning of life, and none of the problems of this world will be able to detract us from the Risen Lord. As such, we have no need to fear, for if we apply *faith and reason* in our lives, *"neither height, nor depth, nor anything else in all creation, will be able to separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus our Lord"* (Rom. 8:39).

In the ever-memorable words of St. Paisios the Athonite: "Do not give in to panic. Cowards are of no use to anyone. God looks at a person's situation and helps him... No matter what happens, we must continue to **pray, think and act**. It is best to always stand up to a difficult situation using spiritual means. However, that spiritual boldness, which is born of holiness and striving toward God, is missing today, as is the natural boldness needed in order not to turn coward in the face of danger." Spiritual and natural boldness come from Christ alone, Who said: "My grace is sufficient for you, for My power is made perfect in weakness" (II Cor. 12:9). Therefore, our interpersonal solidarity, our strength, can only be expressed "with all humility and gentleness, with patience, bearing with one another in love" (Eph. 4:2).

Faith in Christ assumes that we have trust and that we allow Him, Who is Truth, to direct us on the path toward His full revelation. During this present Pascha, beloved, we have become pilgrims searching for that revelation. Listen to the voice of God, who directed Israel of Old during the first Pascha. Hear Him now and obey His life-saving directives on what to eat, how to eat, how to dress and be prepared to remain in our homes, yet ready to move at His command. The Lord also told us to mark our door posts with the sign of our faith. Thus, when He enters our homes and our hearts, He will prevent any misfortune from entering our lives (cf. Exodus 12:1-13). Through the Risen Savior, *"we know that we have passed from death to life because we love one another"* (I Jn. 3:14).

Therefore, beloved, let us together with the plentitude of Christ's Holy Church, our firm community and our sure source of faith, hope and love, now, more than ever, from all our heart exclaim:

CHRIST IS RISEN! INDEED, HE IS RISEN!

Dear Parishioners,

COVID-19 CHURCH IMPACT

Since the COVID-19 mitigation process has been in effect and with Bishop Irinej moving to church services without our faithful; I'm sure you are aware the impact it's had on our church. We can't attend and pray together; the mothers club can't host coffee clutch after church; so we can't socialize and enjoy each other. The choir can't hold rehearsals; The KCC's can't make noodles. The Men's club can't meet and is wondering when they can schedule a picnic. The executive board is not even allowed to meet; only by conference call and video conferencing.

So life at St. Elijah, like the country and economy has virtually stopped. Fortunately Fr. Branislav has come up with a live streaming option for church services and is working on enhancing this experience with a permanent solution. At least we can now attend church even though it is at home. We are at least connected again until we can be reunited.

Like the economy, we are also experiencing a financial setback. As you are aware a vast majority of our revenue comes from you, our parishioners, through tasa basket donations. Our church envelopes; weekly; Easter; special envelopes; church dues and appeals for capital projects (Building & Grounds envelope) all come from our membership. You are the biggest part of our St. Elijah economy. Since we haven't been in church, our donations have suffered.

Only a month ago or so, I thought for sure, I would be writing an appeal letter to you about donating to our capital improvement projects. Instead we are working on solutions so you can continue with your contributions to solidify our church finances. Therefore, the first thing we have to do is stabilize our donations.

Another integral part of our revenue is church dues. This has been in place since the inception of our church's founding in 1914. Again, since we haven't been in church our dues collections have practically stopped. Our financial secretary recently mailed out reminders. Paying your dues sooner than later would really help.

The next part of our church revenue comes from our fundraisers; *the golf outing; the spring and fall food festivals; the ladies tea and the purse bash.* As of today we can't have the golf outing or the spring food festival. The ladies tea we're not sure of. The financial impact of losing those fundraisers is \$25,000 to the church. We are working on alternative fundraisers for the back half of the year, but we just aren't sure what we'll be able to do and when. We are thinking through different ways to replace this revenue. We will communicate this as we sort it out.

Another part of our church revenue comes from special appeals for Capital Improvements. A few years ago it was the church painting project; last year it was the cupola project at the chapel. This year we have the center roof; church mortar joints including roof cap stones; bell tower; cupola; windows; altar area; parish house chimney's etc; painting church windows; and new lighting system in church basement; kitchen and parish house basement as well as a few other smaller projects. Ordinarily, this message would be identifying these projects and asking you to contribute incrementally to your normal contributions for these capital improvements.

The center roof; church mortar joints; parish house chimney repairs are under contract and we have no choice but to proceed. Some of this work is currently in progress.

We do have some good news in all of this; prior to Covid-19 hitting us, John Buffalini (Barb Kozlina Buffalini's husband) came forward and in a major act of stewardship, offered to take on the entire church basement lighting project himself. He is purchasing all the lights, new fixtures and suppling all of the labor. He did this all at his own cost. This saved our church well over \$10,000. I can't express our gratitude enough for John's & Barb's love for our church to be able to help us like this. This is way above any expectation and has had a major positive impact on our budget. John, thank you so very much! It is greatly appreciated and especially now!

Furthermore, due to these unprecedented circumstances, we are going to put all other projects on hold until things return to normal; or the new normal. Even at that time, we will still take a conservative approach and be prudent when it comes to the finances.

This is a challenging time for all of us, for our families and our church family. This won't be easy, but I know God will show us the way. This is a test of faith. I know the power of all of us united is greater than this disruption that has confronted us. I know there hasn't been a challenge that our St. Elijah parish didn't rise to the occasion for. There is no doubt that we will rise above it again. Adversity doesn't build character, it reveals it!

We believe with your unwavering support, we will not only be able to stabilize our contributions, we will be able to sustain our overall finances. We understand some of you may have been impacted by the economy, so we are only asking for everyone to do what they can. Some may be able to do the same, some may be able to still help more; some may have to help a little less; maybe some can't help at all at this time; and no matter what, it's all ok. We will still make it together. If you can't help financially at this time, it's ok. When we get rolling again, maybe you can help in a different way.

We would like to thank everyone who has started mailing in your donations! We thank you for recognizing this! It is greatly appreciated! We are getting questions and inquiries on how to donate. Please look on the next page for "CHURCH DONATION QUESTIONS (Q & A)." You can find answers on how to continue your donations. We thank you in advance for all of your support especially in this unprecedented challenging time.

Church Donation Questions (Q & A)

Q-1: Since I can't come to church, and put our church envelope in the basket, what do I do?

A: Do what you always do: Write a check; put it in your church envelope; but place it inside a regular envelope; put a stamp on it and mail it to the church.

Q-2: I can't find my church envelopes; do I have to wait for next month's church envelopes?

A: No, you don't have to wait; simply write a check; in the memo line; write what the check is for: Weekly offering; Easter; Buildings & Grounds; etc ; then mail it to the church. Also if you know your church envelope acct. number (last name initial and number) place it in memo.

Q-3: Can I just write a check and mail it in a regular envelope without a church envelope? A: Yes, see answer above in **Q-2**.

Q-4: Can I put multiple church envelopes inside the regular envelope I'm mailing to church?

A: Yes, just like you bring multiple envelopes to church for the basket; put them in a regular envelope and mail it!

Q-5: What about my church dues? I always put my dues envelope in the basket.

A: Write your check; in memo mark it dues; put in dues envelope; place dues envelope in regular envelope; put a stamp on it & mail to church: Attention: Financial Secretary

Q-6: I always donated weekly; I don't want to mail envelopes on a weekly basis; can I just make a monthly donation?

A: Absolutely; whatever is convenient for you is fine.

Q-7: I don't have any regular envelopes at home to mail my church envelopes. I'm not leaving the house right now. What do I do?

A: No worries; Starting in May; Your church envelope packet will include two self-addressed return envelopes that you can put your church envelopes in and mail. All we ask is to put a stamp on it.

A: Another option would be on-line bill pay through your bank. See next page Q-8



OnLine Banking Option

Q-8: What about online bill pay? I pay all of my monthly home bills through my banks online payment system. Can I send the church a check just like I do when I'm paying my home bills?

A: Absolutely; this is probably the easiest and most convenient way to donate. Most people do it monthly when they pay their bills; you can even set up an automatic payment.

All you have to do is set the church up like you did for your other vendors; every bank has this. The terminology is a little different but it all works the same way. Just follow these easy steps.

- Go to Payment Center / Bill Pay / Pay Bills
- Click Add Payee
- Complete the information in the Boxes
 - > Name: St. Elijah Serbian Orthodox Church
 - > Address: 2200 Irwin Street, Aliquippa PA 15001
 - Phone: 724.375.4074
- If it asks you for account number: type your name & envelope account (It's the Red letter/number on church envelope); if you don't have it; no worries. Your name is fine.
- When you make your donation a memo line may pop up; See answer in Q-2.
- Just hit send; your bank will mail your check to the church & no charge for the stamp!

Q-9: Currently I don't pay my monthly home bills through my banks online payment system, but I would like to send my church donations this way. Can I do that?

A: Absolutely! You can set up an on line account with your bank on your computer, mobile phone or i-pad/tablet.

• Just follow the steps above in **Q-8** and in minutes you will be set up.

Q-10: I don't see a "donate button" on our church web-site. Will one be coming soon?A: We are looking into this as a future option. In the meantime, please use the options above.

Q-11: What steps can I take to help the church financially right now?

- Please pay your dues as soon as possible.
- Please mail in your donations.
- Consider Online banking as a donation option.
- Maintain your usual donation levels as well as Easter & any special envelopes you use.
- If possible; consider incremental donations to our church projects. (This is the Building & Grounds envelopes) We have received an exemption from the Diocese. Donations for our church projects won't be subject to the Diocese 9% assessment.

The Church's strength, during these difficult and unpredictable times that humanity is experiencing due to the invisible coronavirus, is not manifested through careless and senseless acts. Some believe they are beyond any danger, that their perilous actions might not endanger the lives of those who congregate in places of worship. Jesus did not succumb to the second temptation to manifest His strength by falling off the highest point of Solomon's Temple; instead, He



responded to this challenge by answering "Do Not Tempt the Lord Your God".

The Church's strength is demonstrated through its faithful, who, out of an increased sense of responsibility for the public's welfare, will not attend Church services during this critical time period, but will remain home in prayer.

Is there a more glorious picture than when a whole family is gathered together, at home, on their knees, praying for the salvation of the whole world?

The Church's strength is revealed by the number of "*churches in the house*" operated in every Parish. Furthermore, it is demonstrated, by the number of Christians, who follow Jesus's command "*of going into one's room and praying to one's Father in a secret place*" (Mt. 6:6) and by those who continue the monastic tradition of prayer "in their cells". At this point, it is very useful to remember the power of "prayer in the house" "of Maria, the mother of John, who was also known as Mark (Acts 12:12), in Jerusalem, through which, the Apostle Peter was freed from his chains while in prison.

The Church's strength is further displayed by its believers who long to partake of the Holy Communion, especially during the period of the Great Lent; furthermore, it is also displayed, not only by partaking in the Holy Sacraments, but by the believers' love toward society, when they have to patiently endure their being deprived of them. Let us remember that in the old times, monks would leave their communities, at the beginning of the Great Lent, and headed into the depths of the desert in order to pray in solitude. After forty days, they returned to their monasteries, on Lazarus' Saturday, so that they may receive Holy Communion on Palm Sunday, eagerly longing to celebrate, together with the other monks the Holy Week and Holy Pascha. Really, how many monks achieved holiness, although they had been deprived of Holy Communion?

And, how many Nuns in their Monasteries are deprived- even today- of receiving the Holy Gifts on a regular basis, due to the absence of priests?

The Church's strength is also revealed by the fervent willingness of its members to voluntarily help their fellow human beings. During similar turbulent times, the Church with its clergy, deacons and laity members was always at the forefront providing humanitarian and philanthropic aid to those in need.

The following example, deriving from the life of the early Church, can be used as a benchmark for today's Christians. In Alexandria, during the 4th century, the outbreak of a deadly plague killed thousands. Horror scenes were rampant across the city. Frightened people, in desperation, abandoned their relatives, seeking refuge on mountain tops and in the desert, trying to save themselves. However, during these devastating moments, according to the writings of a Church Historian, a miracle occurred. "Angels" made their appearance in the city. The city Christians acted like Angels by nursing the sick, regardless of the imminent danger to their own wellbeing. What happened next was that many sick people became well and many Christians died from the plague. This is a testimonial to the Church's strength. A willingness to sacrifice in helping others and the world. This manifestation of strength is an integral part of the Orthodox Ethos. This is the tradition we have inherited by the Ancient Church and our Byzantine ancestors; a Church that implemented extensive philanthropic and social welfare programs.

Today, too, the people of the Church must strive to become an example for others to imitate. Some people do not abide by the government imposed measures, which aim at protecting us from the dangers of the ever present coronavirus. They wrongly choose to engage in behaviors that put at risk the welfare of other human beings, because they believe that a reduced workweek is a good enough reason for them to roam the streets, to spend time in the parks or to congregate along the riverside. Christians, however, must lead by example, that is, by remaining home and praying with a repentant heart for the whole world. This is the living strength of the Church.

Fr Rodney's Remarks on Confession

Matthew 3:6-And were baptized of him in Jordan, confessing their sins. (KJV) The personal confession of sin has a long history enduring through the centuries. When recounting sins to the attentive confessor a desired cleansing effect occurs. Weight is lifted from the heart, mind and soul when a serious confession occurs.



A new beginning takes place for the person confessing and receiving forgiveness. Forgiveness is integral to the confession taking place within God's Holy Church. Barriers of sin existing between the believer and Christ are removed in confession. God's Holy Church provides priests as confessors for the benefit of all believers.

Romans 14:11-For it is written, As I live, saith the Lord, every knee shall bow to me, and every tongue shall confess to God. (KJV)

Priests serve as witnesses before God in the Church during the time of confession. Believers have the opportunity to confess before God throughout the Christian life. The value of confession is learned as a believer matures in the life in Jesus Christ. Serious confession changes the believer's course and direction of personal life. Trust between the person confessing and the confessor is of paramount importance. Believers confess with the expectations their repentance will be fully confidential. The relationship between believer and confessor strengthens with passing of time.

James 5:16-Confess your faults one to another, and pray one for another, that ye may be healed. The effectual fervent prayer of a righteous man availeth much. (KJV)

Prayer occurs throughout the act of confession from beginning until the very end. Believers need to want to benefit from confession and begin anew to be healed. A change in heart and mind are expected in the healing process of forgiveness. The darkness of sins is eradicated as sins come to light in the act of repentance. Repentance puts in motion the desire for unity with Christ and casting away sin. Firm belief in the love and healing power of Christ empower the act of repentance. The confessor utilizes the prayers of the Church in the granting of forgiveness.

1 John 1:9-If we confess our sins, he is faithful and just to forgive us our sins, and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness. (KJV)

Confessors often give guidance and encourage certain actions during confession. Joy in Jesus Christ results as the repentant believer receives forgiveness of sin. Confession brings new responsibilities to live in ways pleasing to the Lord God. Forgiveness is a new birth in Christ with the expectation to honor Christ's ways. The life in Jesus Christ necessitates constant repentance to ensure continued unity. Believers will sin throughout life and are to repent of those sins with regularity. God's Holy Church encourages believers to make wise use of confession in life.

This will give you the ability to mail in your church envelopes since we can't have church services with our faithful right now.

Just follow these easy steps:



We use this opportunity to thank Mr. and Mrs. Buffalini for their kindness. May God bless them and their family abundantly!




