Most beloved clergy and monastics, sons and daughters, faithful children
of the God-protected Eastern American Diocese of our Holy Church!

We greet you on this most radiant and most joyous Feast of Feasts –
Christ's Resurrection from the dead, with the all-glorious,
ever resounding and vivifying Christian greeting:


CHRIST IS RISEN!

Emanating from a paternal heart replete with Paschal joy, We join in
proclaiming the triumphant victory of life and light over death and darkness,
deeply inspired by the hymnography of Saint John of Damascus:

O Christ, great and most holy Pascha!
O Wisdom, Word and Power of God,
Grant that we may more perfectly partake of You
in the never-ending day of Your Kingdom!
(Paschal Canon—Song 9)

“Christ is Risen, my joy”, exclaims St. Seraphim of Sarov, joining in the chorus of
that reverberating proclamation of immeasurable Paschal joy, which is gone
out into all the world. For Christ is Risen, indeed, my Beloved! This great and
most holy Pascha has burst into our world, the world of time, space, and matter,
of real history, real people, and real life! The Wisdom, Word and Power of God
has destroyed death and darkness, as “the glory of God is man fully alive” in the
words of St. Irenaeus of Lyon.


Yet, our minds and imaginations, it seems, cannot fathom the fulness of the
Paschal Mystery, as we endeavor to fit the luminous and explosive fact of the
Resurrection into the minute and fragmented possibilities we already know.
While at the same time, contemporary society attempts to overshadow this
victory of life and light by offering corruption as freedom, education void of
illumination, and advocating false choices in life. “If so, then the end of the
world is not before us, but behind us”, prophetically warns the Holy Bishop
Nicholai of Zhicha and Ochrid, “and humanity is not existing only in a Paradise
lost, but in a Life lost too”.



Take heed, for this very reason, the Holy Apostle Paul cautions us: “Now, brothers and sisters, I want to remind you of the gospel I preached to you, which you received and on which you have taken your stand. By this gospel you are saved, if you hold firmly to the word, I preached to you. Otherwise, you have believed in vain. For what I received I passed on to you as of first importance: that Christ died for our sins according to the Scriptures, that He was buried, that He was raised on the third day according to the Scriptures” (I Cor. 15:1-4). As such, our only goal, Beloved, is to be united in Christ, and become part of a stream, that converges into a forceful river uniting in Him and with Him in Whom alone lies the fulness, and with it the beauty of real freedom, truth and righteousness such as we have never known.

Our saintly Bishop Nicholai likens this image of a river to the community of our salvation. According to him, individuals are like a stream, which easily freezes in the winter; yet, we are as a mighty river, which continues to flow even in the dead of winter when we join one another. As a community, together, we become the iconic likeness of the Church. For we are members of the Body of the Risen Christ, which is the ark of our covenant and ark of our salvation. As the great Psalmist David sang: “The Lord is my strength and my shield; my heart trusts in Him, and He helps me. My heart leaps for joy, and with my song I praise Him. The Lord is the strength of His people, a fortress of salvation for His anointed one.” (Ps. 27:7-8).

Analogous to the words of Bishop Nicholai, who preached in New York many years ago in 1921 to the then builders of contemporary society, concerning Christ as “the stone which the builders have rejected” (Ps. 118:22). He compares those who attempt to build a foundation for a mill by sinking their only large stone in the middle of a riverbed and constructing a mill with small stones found at the edge of the riverbank, which are easily carried away by the water. Then, as today, if such small stones are used in the construction of society, they too shall be taken by the flowing river. The one essential stone is the Crucified and Risen Lord – our only fortress, our corner stone and secure foundation.



Therefore, Most Beloved, to more perfectly partake of Him in the never-ending day of His Kingdom; let us rejoice in our common quest for the restoration of truth and righteousness with the plentitude of Christ's Holy Church, our firm community and sure salvation, now, more than ever, from all our heart exclaiming:

**CHRIST IS RISEN!
INDEED, HE IS RISEN!**

“Why do you seek the Living among the dead?

He is not here, but is risen!

” Luke 24:5-6

Dear Parishioners,

These astounding words were uttered by the archangel to the Myrrhbearing women who, according to custom, came to the tomb to anoint the body of Jesus. When the archangel told them that Christ is Risen – they ran and told the apostles, and joy spread throughout the entire world. That same joy resonates in the universe to this very day!

Over the next 40 days, after His resurrection, the Lord appeared to the apostles as well as to many others and then He ascended into heaven. Sometimes we think that we, who live almost 2000 years after this event, are deprived of the true joy and ability to see the Risen Lord with our own eyes. We may also think that by celebrating Pascha today we are only keeping the memory of the event from the past.

However, the timeless Lord is the same “yesterday, today and tomorrow” and His resurrection is always present. As we celebrate the Feast of Feasts – the glorious Resurrection of our Lord – we experience the joy of the Myrrhbearing women at the Resurrection Matins. That bliss takes us from one divine liturgy to another, where we recognize the Risen Lord in the “breaking of bread” just as the two disciples have seen Him on the road to Emmaus.

In the light of these words, I sincerely look forward to seeing Christ in you and breaking bread with you at the upcoming divine services so that we can all together partake in the everlasting joy of Christ’s glorious resurrection!



PASCHA - THE NEW PASSEOVER

Orthodox Christians around the world celebrate Pascha - the Resurrection of Jesus Christ - as the culmination of a marathon Holy Week that spans eight days and encompasses 18 distinct services.

Most Americans know the feast as Easter, widely believed to be derived from the name of the Anglo-Saxon dawn goddess *Ēostre* who may, in turn, have had her origins in the Greek pagan goddess of the dawn *Ēōs*. However, the Orthodox Church and much of the rest of the Christian world uses "Pascha" (Πάσχα), which comes from the Hebrew term for Passover -- Pesach (פֶּסַח) -- the observance of Jews' Exodus from slavery in Egypt. Ancient Christians adopted this term because they saw Jesus' Resurrection as the "New Passover" celebrating humankind's Exodus from slavery to sin and death.

The formula used by Orthodox to determine the date of Pascha has its roots in the First Ecumenical Council, which was convened in 325 A.D. in the city of Nicaea. It utilizes the Julian calendar that was in use in the time of Christ.

It additionally takes into account the date of the Jewish Passover, but calculates it according to the method used by Jews during Christ's life.

Holy Week is not a celebration of long-ago events. It is the reliving of Christ's Passion and Resurrection in the present. The hymns of the week repeatedly use the present tense and the word "today" because Christ's saving Passion and life-giving Resurrection are a present-day reality and hope -- not some far away historical event. Until the end of Holy Week, the lights are kept low and the entire temple is draped in the purple of mourning.

The highlights of Holy Week begin with the Saturday of Lazarus on April 27, a Liturgy which commemorates Jesus' power over death through His raising of His friend Lazarus.

On Palm Sunday, palm branches are distributed and palms fill churches during a Liturgy that reminds worshippers of Christ's triumphal entry into Jerusalem. That evening begins the celebration of a series of four "Bridegroom" services, which culminate on Holy Wednesday evening and are based on the Parable of the Bridegroom found in Matthew 25. It reminds us that Jesus approached humankind to make Himself one with us, as a bridegroom approaches to become one with his bride. On Holy Thursday morning the Church commemorates the founding the sacrament of the Holy Eucharist with a Liturgy that evokes the Last Supper, known by Orthodox as the Mystical Supper.

A reserved host -- the Body and Blood of Jesus Christ consecrated from leavened bread and wine -- is prepared at this service and is preserved on the altar the whole year as a sign of Christ's real and living presence in His temple. Holy Thursday evening sees a reenactment of Jesus' carrying his cross to Golgotha. Extensive passages of the four Gospels are read during this timeless service while clergy carry an almost full-scale cross upon which has on it a representation of Jesus' body.



The service of the Royal Hours is read on Holy Friday morning, chronicling the hours during which Jesus suffered on the Cross. Following this, faithful decorate a carved wooden canopy, representing the tomb of Christ, with a profusion of flowers. Early in the afternoon the relatively brief -- yet deeply moving -- service of the Taking Down from the Cross takes place where the representation of Christ's Body is taken down and placed in a white linen sheet representing His Burial Shroud. A representation of His Body embroidered on velvet is then placed in the tomb for the faithful mourn over and venerate.

Perhaps the single most moving service of the Orthodox ecclesiastical calendar is the candlelit Lamentations before the Tomb celebrated on Holy Friday evening. Christ's Tomb is carried, usually around the outside of the temple, in a funeral procession of the Lord. No one can fail to be moved by this, and the ancient hymn melodies and words, which bring to life the grief and suffering of the Virgin Mary and Jesus' followers.

Holy Saturday dawns with a Liturgy during which clergy scatter bay leaves in the temple as a sign of the incipient power of the coming Resurrection which sweeps away the accumulated detritus of the ages piled up against the Gates of Hell, which Christ's Resurrection blew open once and for all.

Just before midnight on Saturday night, lights are extinguished and the chief celebrant emerges from the altar with a single flame, symbolizing Christ's Resurrection, which is passed to the waiting congregation. All then proceed outside where the Resurrection is proclaimed to the world and the hymn "Christ is Risen" sung, and its words exchanged as a greeting among the faithful.

Finally, the great news of Christ's glorious resurrection is proclaimed in different languages. The multiple languages remind all of the universal nature and message of Jesus' Resurrection.

In the end, no description can do justice to the multifaceted journey with Christ that Orthodox Holy Week is. It must be lived.

The Board of Trustees of the St. Elijah Serbian Orthodox Endowment for the Future wishes to greet all members of our parish community with the joyous Paschal proclamation:

**Christ is Risen! Indeed He is Risen!
Hristos Vaskrse! Vaistinu Vaskrse!**

May our Risen Lord grant us the strength, wisdom, and faith we need to continue building up our parish in all ways, and may he richly reward all those who have and continue to support the ministries of our parish!

The Endowment Trustees have set as their priority in 2023 working collaboratively with our parishioners on strategies to grow our Endowment and to determine what our parishioners envision as the best and most important targeted uses of those funds. Following the Divine Liturgy on March 12, 2023, the Trustees had the pleasure of making their first formal presentation to parishioners, to explain the Endowment’s background, current status, and objectives. During that presentation, the Trustees highlighted three important parameters within which the Endowment operates:

- The Endowment’s investment objective is long-term growth. Pursuant to its bylaws, the Endowment will make no distribution for the first ten years of its existence (i.e., until 2029) or until it reaches \$1,000,000 in assets.
- The Endowment was created to support the long-term viability of the St. Elijah parish, which includes all parish ministries and properties (including the parish cemetery and chapel).
- Fundraising for the Endowment will not compete with parishioners’ regular giving. The Endowment will seek funding exclusively from donations beyond regular giving to the parish.

The March 12 presentation included a number of questions from parishioners, many of which focused on the issue of, “What specifically will the Endowment monies be used for?” This is an excellent question, and in the minds of the Trustees, it is one that can only be answered once input is received from our

parishioners, so that we as a parish can cultivate a shared understanding and expectation of the best uses for the Endowment. Nevertheless, the Trustees have identified a number of possible approaches that can be considered. They include:

- **Operational Support:** Funding specific parish operating budget line- items (such as utility costs, priest's salary, etc.), to lessen the burden of those costs on parishioners' regular giving.
- **Infrastructure Preservation:** Contributing to projects that address critical maintenance needs that arise with respect to the parish's physical plant (church, chapel, cemetery, center, etc.).
- **Transformational Initiatives:** Funding ministries of the parish that can foster growth of the parish and parish life, such as enhancement of the parish's Christian education programs, expansion of community outreach ministries, or the development of new ministries directed at reaching those who are seeking life in the Orthodox faith or re- engaging with those who have fallen away from the parish over time.

No matter whether these or other uses for the Endowment ultimately are pursued, one thing is clear: **The Endowment will offer our parish a means to accomplish things that we may not have been able to accomplish without it!** As such, all of us – as a parish – have a responsibility to reflect prayerfully on what we want our parish to be over the short-term and long-term future, and to offer ideas so that we can plan together accordingly. The Trustees look forward to continuing their discussion with parishioners about these critical topics over the course of 2023. Please keep watch in the weekly bulletins for information on additional discussion sessions. And, as always, feel free to contact any Trustee with questions or ideas about this wonderful ministry!
